CORRESPONDENCE:

- 1) From U11 Riverdale/Pompton Lakes travel baseball team requesting use of a baseball field at Independence Park for their team. - 1) An application has been received from Planet Aid to place a clothing bin in the parking lot of 90 Route 23 North for which they have received permission from the property owner. They have been informed of the parameters of the borough ordinance regarding placing of clothing bins and that a public hearing will be held on July 18, 2011 at 7:30 p.m. if they complete the requirements stated in the ordinance.

There was no discussion on this matter.

BOROUGH CLERK REPORT:

Deputy Clerk Forbes reported that it is time to make room reservations for the League of Municipalities Convention. Mayor Budesheim stated that reservations should be made since they can be cancelled until November 9th. Ms. Forbes stated that an employee has inquired whether the Borough would pay for the cost of a pizza luncheon for Chief Soules on his last day of work on June 15th. They estimated the cost to be \$150.

Thereupon, Councilman Astarita set forth the motion, seconded by Councilman Guis, to approve payment of up to \$150 for a pizza luncheon in recognition of Chief Soules' retirement.

Mayor Budesheim asked Borough Attorney Oostdyk to set up a settlement conference with all parties for the lawsuit we were served with.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Councilman Carelli reported that the fee for summer recreation may be increased by \$100 to \$125 due to the budget cuts in salary and wage for recreation. This may also limit the number of counselors.

Councilman Astarita reported on the Community Development meeting he attended.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION NO. 2:

Acting Police Chief Kevin Smith stated that the Police Department has been accepting applications for part-time dispatchers. They are down to one part-time dispatcher who is regularly available and the others now have full time jobs. Applicants have been narrowed down to four that he would like to put on our books. Two will require about 30
