To Avoid the Flu

- ▶ Avoid close contact with people who are sick
- ▶ Stay home when you are sick
- ▶ Cover your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing
- ▶ Wash your hands often with warm water. Lather, scrub for 20 seconds, then rinse.
- ▶ Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.



Fee for Flu shot is \$15

No charge with Medicare Part B (with no HMO).

To ensure continuity of care, the best place to obtain a flu shot is your doctor's office.

Helpful Health Hints - An Alternative View

Many people want to be proactive to reduce their risk of getting the flu. It is fall, the time of year when many people are making the decision about whether to receive the flu shot. However, the general public is expressing concern about the reported risks from flu shot vaccines. In the Washington Free Press (Nov/Dec 2004) the headlines of an article by D. Miller, M.D. read *Want to Avoid Alzheimer's?...then forget the flu vaccine.* Why? A statement in the 1998 issue of John Hopkins Newsletter affirmed this increase in Alzheimer's by stating that it is expected to quadruple. At the NVIC International Vaccine Conference in Arlington, VA, September 1997, Hugh Fudenburg, M.D. stated that if an individual has had five consecutive flu shots, his/her chance of developing Alzheimer's Disease is 10 times greater than if they had one, two, or no shots (based on ten-year study..1970-1980) When asked why, he said that it is due to the mercury and aluminum that is in the flu shot and in almost all childhood vaccinations. This accumulation in the brain causes cognitive dysfunction. Dr. Fudenburg is the world's leading immunogeneticist and 13th most quoted biologist of our time, and author of nearly 850 papers in peer reviewed journals.
Each individual must decide for him or herself and make an informed decision with regard to their options and risks associated with vaccines. They are drugs and come with side effects that can impact your health now and in the future. Many informed consumers are choosing more natural ways to develop the strongest possible immune system to help prevent sickness.

NOTE: This is not meant to discourage or dissuade anyone from taking advantage of the Riverdale Flu Shot Clinic. This article is merely to present another viewpoint regarding the efficacy of vaccines.
