

My Family and I would like to thank Chief Pat Cleary of the Riverdale Volunteer Fire Department. Chief Cleary has not only served our town well, but also has worked hard to honor Riverdale's only fallen firefighter.

Joseph Ezzo, a life-long resident of Riverdale, had served his town for many years. "Papa Joe", as he was known to many in town, died 25 years ago in the line of duty.

My son and I were given the honor to accompany Chief Cleary and other fellow firefighters to the National Fallen Firefighter's Memorial in Emmitsburg, Maryland. On October 6, 2007 after Chief Cleary's research and dedication, Joseph "Papa Joe" Ezzo was listed as a fallen firefighter. It was a great tribute to a man who loved his hometown and serving the people of Riverdale.



Papa Joe's sister Filomena Franco, and her husband Nick, represented the Ezzo family.
