FIRE DEPARTMENT



The fire department responded to 139 emergencies as of November 28th. There is a good chance that in 2007 we will surpass 144 emergencies which is the highest number of responses on record. Visit our website www.riverdalefd.net and click on "Incident Data" to see statistics on emergency responses, including a graph of Historical Incident Data back to the 1930's when the fire department responded to 20 emergencies per year. Thank you to all the residents for your support during our annual fund drive. Because the new method of soliciting donations via the mail there is a possibility the original letters were misplaced or mis-delivered, we will be sending out additional letters in the next few days so that you may have a chance to donate. Thank you for your patience during this transition.

Each year fires occurring during the holiday season injure 2,600 individuals and cause over \$930 million in damage. Increased use of candles and improperly maintained live Christmas trees are the major causes. Visit our website www.riverdalefd.net and click on the "Holiday Fire Safety" link. Helpful Health Hints - An Alternative View

Coenzyme Q10 is an antioxidant that is structurally similar to vitamin E. It plays a crucial role in the generation of cellular energy, is a significant immunologic stimulant, increases circulation, has anti-aging effects, and is beneficial for the cardiovascular system. Coenzyme Q10 is found in highest concentrations in the heart, followed by the liver, kidney, spleen and pancreas. Within the mitochondria, the cells' energy-production centers, coenzyme Q10 helps to metabolize fats and carbohydrates. It also helps to maintain the flexibility of cell membranes.

In Japan, coenzyme Q10 has been approved for use in treating congestive heart failure. Various research reports suggest that coenzyme Q10 also may be beneficial in treating cancer, AIDS, muscular dystrophy, allergies, gastric ulcers, myopathy and diabetes.
