

Winter Tips

The new year is here and hopefully we won't have too many bad snow storms. Here are some weather driving tips. **On Ice or Snow:**

- Bridges and overpasses freeze first. Always slow down and avoid sudden changes in speed or direction.
- Keep windows clear.
- Keep your speed steady and slow.
- Use your brakes cautiously. Abrupt braking can cause brake lock-up and cause you to lose steering control.
- For Anti-Lock brakes to work correctly, apply constant, firm pressure to the pedal. During an emergency, stop, push the brake pedal all the way to the floor.
- If you get stuck in snow, straighten the wheels and accelerate slowly. Avoid spinning the tires. Use sand or cinders under the drive wheels.

Fire Department

Glancing Back - Looking Forward

The Riverdale Fire Department had a very challenging and productive 99th year of service. As our community has grown, so has the demand for fire department services. At this time, we have responded to 143 calls for assistance. That is more than 7% in 2005 and double the calls received only ten years earlier in 1995. The members spent a great deal of time reviewing the plans for the Wal-Mart complex and the condos at The Grande. As each building is completed the members do a walk through to familiarize themselves with the layout of the building, and the location of utilities and other key building components. Each member of the department contributed an average of 150 hours to our community during 2006.

During the first half of 2006 our membership grew by 3 as new Junior Firefighters joined, but unfortunately during the year 3 existing members had other commitments causing their participation to be drastically reduced.

In 2007 the Riverdale Volunteer Fire Department will celebrate its 100th Anniversary, with events planned throughout the year to acknowledge such a feat. If anyone is interested in joining us in the beginning of our second century of service to the community, stop by the fire house any Monday night, or call 973-831-1584.

Recently the **Pequanock River Coalition** has taken on 2 projects of interest to Riverdale residents, the first being a Natural Resource Inventory. This is a no-nonsense report on the natural resources of a community, useful in guiding

land use and preservation decisions. Riverdale, though small in size, is surprisingly complex, hosting sensitive wildlife from wild trout to otters, and we are dependent on groundwater for potable water supply, making water quality a critical concern. The report is due in 2007.

The second project is the creation of a water trail on the Pequanock, Ramapo and Pompton Rivers. This boating route will not only offer recreation, but will also link protected open space in Riverdale, Pompton Lakes and Pequanock. Currently the group is laying the groundwork for access sites and determining routes. A map and guide will be released in mid-2007.

Riverdale School Threatened

Editor's Note: *It has been the policy of this newsletter to stay away from political issues, since its purpose is to share the pleasant news and events of your neighbors. However, this issue is of such importance to the life of our community, and because of its urgency, we believe that it is worthy of an exception from our policy.* Mayor William Budeshim

From the Superintendent, Dr. Betty Ann Wyks.

On January 8, 2007 the State Senate is set to reconvene to vote on several bills (S7, S10 and S4) which, in our opinion, will negatively impact the quality of education of the students of Riverdale. We want to make you aware of the potential impact these bills may have on our town.

Forced Consolidation and Loss of Control. If enacted into law, these bills will potentially eliminate the Riverdale School District as we know it, forcing us to merge with one or more other districts, resulting in a loss of local control of educational decisions affecting our students. Decisions affecting course offerings, extracurricular activities, class size, hiring, and budget priorities will be made at the county level by a political appointee, someone who has little or no knowledge of Riverdale as a community.

Potential for Increased Taxes. Additionally, these bills may result in increased taxes for our community as we lose the ability to make decisions regarding our own budget. More importantly, we would no longer be the neighborhood school district that we so appreciate and for which so many of the residents of Riverdale moved to town.

The Riverdale Board of Education believes that this legislation is not in the best interests of either our children or taxpayers. We encourage you to exercise your rights by sharing your concerns with our government representatives. Sen.
