NEWARK, N.J. Glancing Back - Looking Forward

February 25, 2007 will mark the 100th Anniversary of the formation of the Pompton Volunteer Fire Department, later renamed as the Riverdale Volunteer Fire Department. The first chief, E.R. Richards, led the first group of volunteers as they built the fire department from scratch by raising funds to rent a meeting space, purchase equipment and to acquire the first fire house. That building is still located on Hamburg Turnpike and is currently occupied by TriCounty Industrial Supply. Before the current Municipal Building was constructed in 1959 the second floor housed the borough offices. The current members and the community owe a debt of gratitude to the commitment and dedication of our founding members, and we strive to keep their dream of a volunteer fire department alive.

There will be various celebrations throughout the year to commemorate *A Century of Service*, starting with a small private ceremony on the morning of February 25. Our 100th annual installation dinner will be held on March 3, and all past members of the department have been invited, as well as various dignitaries. We are in the process of creating an Ad Journal that will reflect the tradition of the department and we are looking for sponsors to be a part of this historical publication.

The public celebration will be on August 25. It will start with a somber ceremony 25 years to the day that Papa Joe Ezzo made the ultimate sacrifice to Riverdale and died in the line of duty. Later that day there will be a "wetdown" at the firehouse, followed by a concert and fireworks in the park. There will be commemorative T-shirts and mugs for sale throughout the year. We hope all residents can join us in celebrating this significant milestone.

ANOTHER REMINDER. There is a drop box available 24/7 in the lobby of the Municipal Building for tax, sewer and water payments. Separate checks should be made out for the taxes and each utility.

JUST ONE MORE. Nominating petitions for the Board of Education must be filed with the Board Secretary on or before Monday, February 26 - 4 PM.

Safety Still a Priority. Please follow the "kiss and drop" morning procedure. Drop off for the **K-8 students** is at the back of the school, near the shed area.
