

HEART ATTACK WARNING SIGNS

Some heart attacks are sudden and intense, but most start lowly with mild pain or discomfort. Often people affected are not sure what is wrong and wait too long before getting help. Here are the signs and symptoms of a heart attack.

- Chest discomfort Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts for more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It may feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness, or pain.
- Discomfort in other areas of the upper body Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw, or stomach.
- Shortness of breath May occur with or without chest discomfort.
- Other signs These may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea, or lightheadedness.

Call 911. It is almost always the fastest way to get lifesaving treatment. EMS can begin life saving treatment when they arrive. The staffs are also trained to revive someone whose heart has stopped. Patients with chest pain who arrive by ambulance usually receive faster treatment at the hospital.
