In Case of Emergency: Have you "ICED" Your Phone?

To its owner, the cell phone is an indispensable lifeline at times of crisis, reuniting loved ones separated by unforeseen events at the touch of a button. But for members of the emergency services making life-and-death decisions, the cell poses a conundrum: Which of the numbers stored in its electronic address book should they call to reach a casualty's next of kin?

Cell users are being urged to put the acronym ICE: "In Case of Emergency" -- before the names of the people they want to designate as next of kin in their cell address book, creating entries such as "ICE -- Dad" or "ICE -- Karen".

Paramedics, police and firefighters often waste valuable time trying to figure out which name in a cell phone to call when disaster strikes, according to current and retired members of the emergency services, who said they must look through wallets for clues, or scroll through cell address books and guess.

Helpful Health Hints - An Alternative View

Vitamin K Reverses Artery Hardening? As we all know, it's not good when fat deposits build up on the artery walls. But it is even worse when the body deposits bits of calcium in the fat deposits. This makes the artery plaque stiff and hard, giving rise to the term "hardening of the arteries." Of course, the artery wall is then much less elastic. An amazing new study indicates that **vitamin K** may not only prevent, but actually reverse artery calcification. Researchers in the Netherlands gave rats with hardening of the arteries high doses of vitamin K. After six weeks, the calcium deposits in their arteries had declined by 50%! And their arteries regained their elasticity comparable to a normal rat. This makes sense. We know that vitamin K is necessary for calcium to be put to its proper use-to build bone. If calcium cannot be properly used, the body starts to look for other places to put it, and we get calcium deposits.

Would this work for humans? In two large studies, the Nurses' Health Study and the Rotterdam Study, it was found that the highest vitamin K intake reduced the risk of artery calcification by 52%, and reduced the risk of death from cardiovascular disease by up to 57%. Interestingly, the type of vitamin K that was found the most beneficial was the kind made in our own intestines by the friendly bacteria (*probiotics*).

Of course, some people can't take vitamin K supplements because they are on anti-coagulant medication. Drugs such as coumadin (warfarin) are vitamin K antagonists. This is based on the idea that vitamin K is necessary for normal blood clotting.

Question: How did the researchers in the above study induce artery hardening in the rats? Answer: By giving them coumadin! And in a previous study, it was found that people on blood thinning medication were twice as likely to have calcification in their arteries.
