

Flu Shots: Effective?

Flu shots for the elderly are far less effective than doctors and governments like to tell us. In fact, they are incapable of preventing up to half of all deaths from influenza and pneumonia in the elderly, new data suggests. As it is, government health bodies present the annual flu vaccine as something that every elderly person should have - and yet there is virtually no evidence to support this stridently optimistic approach.

The Cochrane Vaccines Field group first alerted doctors to the ineffectiveness of the standard flu jab when it discovered that it failed to prevent deaths from flu or pneumonia. Despite this, governments have continued to spend millions of dollars on an ineffective vaccine, and have misled the public.

The only way of resolving the issue once and for all is to carry out proper trials among the elderly - and that's something nobody will be prepared to do, the researchers fear. *The Lancet*, 2007;370: 1199-1200

Recycling - think Green - think Dollars

Most residents are aware of our recycling pickups for paper and commingled bottles and cans on alternate Fridays. First Friday of each month is for metals: pipes, gym equipment, shelving, patio furniture, grills and other types of metal.

By conscientiously recycling we can save tax dollars. We pay \$84 a ton for all trash picked up. All items supposed to be recycled but instead put in the trash increases the weight and the cost of disposal. If each household could pull out 100 lbs. of recyclables from the trash we will save over \$5000 in tax money.

Simple acts, such as dumping the dirt out of flower pots before disposing, put your batteries aside and drop them off every couple of months. Hold on to old computer equipment and printers until our next collection day. We are sure you can expand upon these suggestions. IMPORTANT NOTICE! Our Fire Department is concerned about their inability to get the fire trucks onto certain streets because of illegal parking. Under state law NO PARKING is permitted 1. Within an intersection 2. On a crosswalk 3. In front of a driveway 4. On a sidewalk 5. **Within 50' of a stop sign** 6. **Within 25' of an intersection** 7. Within 10' of a fire hydrant. There are other provisions in the law (NJSA 39:4-138) you may want to read. Our Police Department will be enforcing these state laws to ensure that public safety is maintained, especially the accessibility of our fire trucks to the streets in our residential neighborhoods.
