Riverdale Senior Community Center Riverdale Youth Canteen

Dedicated on November 22, 2008

In addition to a number of residents in attendance were Morris County Freeholders Doug Cabana and Bill Chegwidan, Morris County School Superintendent Kathleen Serafino and former Riverdale School Superintendent Mario Cardinale. The dedication was hosted by the Mayor and Council along with the Riverdale Board of Education and Superintendent Dr. Betty Ann Wyks.

The building is now complete with the upstairs' Great Room being used for all types of events, borough and private. It is 2500 square feet and holds up to 200 people. This level was built to satisfy the ever-growing senior citizen club. They hold their meetings in the Great Room and have a smaller meeting room for daily activities.

The lower level is to be used primarily as a youth center, known as the Riverdale Youth Canteen, hosting programs for young people of all ages. The main room is as large as the upper level's. This room is also available for residential functions, doubling the availability for rental. The building both levels, is 10,000 square feet.

The Community Center was built with the cooperation of the Governing Body and the Board of Education. It is a testament to cooperation between the two boards.
