Feds admit vaccine 'aggravated' autism.

The federal government continues to deny a link between vaccines and autism, but the U.S. Court of Federal Claims has ruled in favor of a child alleged to have regressed into autism as a result of vaccinations.

Several of the vaccinations included the controversial mercury-based preservative thimerosal, points out the National Autism Association, which sees the ruling as confirmation of the claims of many parents.

"This case echoes the stories of thousands of children across the country," said NAA President Wendy Fournier. "With almost 5,000 similar cases pending in vaccine court, we are confident that this is just the first of many that will confirm what we have believed for so long - vaccines can and do cause children to regress into autism."

Fournier called on the Centers for Disease Control "to acknowledge that the current vaccine schedule is not safe for every child and as with the administration of any medicine, individual risks and susceptibilities must be considered for each patient."

Thimerosal in vaccines is suspected of causing brain damage and weakening the immune system, making some children susceptible later to infection from measles, mumps and rubella shots.

Kirby, writing for the Huffington Post, reported the government's written concession said the child had a pre-existing mitochondrial disorder that was "aggravated" by her shots and ultimately resulted in a diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder, or ASD.

"This statement is good news for the girl and her family, who will now be compensated for the lifetime of care she will require," Kirby writes. "But its implications for the larger vaccine-autism debate, and for public health policy in general, are not as certain."

Liz Harsley Goes Under the Knife for a Stranger

When Liz Harsley got the call telling her she was the perfect bone marrow match for a young girl in desperate need of a transplant, she didn't hesitate. "I absolutely knew I wanted to do it," said Harsley, a 4th-semester biology major and avid crew team member.

Harsley, who was Carlee Wines' roommate her freshman year, said Wines encouraged her to attend the on-campus bone marrow drive held on Nov. 29, 2006 in the Student Union Ballroom. Wines was killed two months later in a hit-and-run accident on campus. "The only reason I came to the drive was because she convinced me to," Harsley said. "I probably wouldn't have even known about it."

Harsley received the call telling her she was a match just two days before the one-year anniversary of Wines' death. After various doctors' appointments and blood tests, she underwent surgery on Wednesday, Feb. 20, at Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston.

Harsley - who has aspirations of becoming a veterinarian - said she wasn't too fazed by the two-hour surgery, which consisted of doctors making 200 small holes into the bone of her lower-back. She only has four visible marks on her skin, because the skin was moved with the needles when puncturing the bone. She won't have any scars.

Harsley was on general anesthesia for the entirety of the surgery, but awoke to a great deal of pain - which she compared to the feeling of a broken bone. While in the hospital, she was put on morphine.

In accordance with the foundation's policies, Harsley isn't allowed to know the name of the 15-year-old patient who received her bone marrow. However, in three months she will be given an update on how the patient is doing. In a year, if both parties agree, the two may be able to meet. During her stay in the hospital, Harsley was allowed to write an anonymous letter to the girl - their only means of communication at this time. The recipient has aplastic anemia, a rare blood disorder in which the body doesn't produce enough new blood cells.
