Vitamin B1 (Thiamine): Its Benefits

Thiamine is involved in all key metabolic processes in the nervous system, the heart, the blood cells, and the muscles. It is useful in the treatment of nervous disorders, and can protect against imbalances caused by alcoholism.

There are more cases of vitamin B1 deficiency than of any other nutritional element. Thiamine is found in all plant and animal foods, but good sources are whole grains, brown rice and seafood.

- Protects against imbalances caused by alcohol consumption.
- B1 may be useful in treating heart disease, as well as anemia.
- May improve people's mental agility.
- May help to control diabetes which has been linked to deficiency.
- Useful in the treatment of herpes and infections.
- Helps to convert sugar to energy, in the muscles and bones.
- Heavy drinkers, smokers, pregnant women should increase dosage up to 100-300mg per day. Recommend do not take more than 400mg per day.
- Increase intake in stressful conditions. Most effective when part of a good B-complex supplement.

IMPORTANT NOTICE! Our Fire Department is concerned about their inability to get the fire trucks onto certain streets because of illegal parking. Under state law **NO PARKING** is permitted 1. Within an intersection 2. On a crosswalk 3. In front of a driveway 4. On a sidewalk 5. **Within 50' of a stop sign** 6. **Within 25' of an intersection** 7. Within 10' of a fire hydrant. Our Police Department will be enforcing these state laws to ensure that public safety is maintained, especially the accessibility of our fire trucks to the streets in our residential neighborhoods.
