


Appalachian Trail Update #2



On June 25th, Jarred Bush, Riverdale friend Mike Failla, and Penn State Delta Chi fraternity brother Lou Barbato began their quest of hiking the Appalachian Trail in Maine by conquering Mt. Kahadin, the 5,262 foot mountain that begins the trail for a north to south hiker. Two days later, they were at Abol Bridge, the beginning of the famous "100 Mile Wilderness". This section of the trail begins with a posted warning..."Do not

attempt unless fully prepared with 10 days of supplies as this is the longest wilderness section of the entire AT, and its difficulty should not be underestimated!" Carrying all their supplies on their backs, they entered the wilderness. Ten days later, after fording streams, scaling rocks, sleeping on the trail in one-person tents or lean-to structures, climbing White Cap Mountain, Chairback Mountain, and Barren Mountain, and hiking through the "Green Tunnel" – miles and miles of tree-lined trails - the three arrived in the town of Monson, Maine on the evening of July 6th for some rest, relaxation, and picking up fresh supplies. After a stay at the Lake Shore House in Monson, Jarred and Lou prepared to continue on the AT, while Mike decided it was time for him to head back home to Riverdale, carrying with him memories of an amazing two weeks (ask him for some stories when you see him).

The next supply drop would be in Caratunk, 35 miles from Monson. Another mountain stood between the two towns – Bald Mountain. Jarred called home from its summit at noon on July 11th. He said the Appalachian Trail in Maine was no hike in the woods – much more like extreme mountain climbing – but by now, both were getting in better shape and making better time through the trails.



They arrived in Caratunk late on July 12, and treated themselves to two days at the Northern Outdoors Resort – a beautiful Maine lodge and camp ground on the banks of the Kennebec River.

They re-entered the trail at Bigelow Preserve, facing the challenge of Mt. Bigelow, 4,150 feet of elevation and the first of five mountains that came between Caratunk and their next supply stop – Rangeley, Maine. Two days into this section, they were sidelined by spider bites that had Lou seeking medical attention, and needing some special care for a few days in Stratton, Maine. The smallest of animals seems to have caused the most trouble on the trail so far! Back on the trail on 7/18 to face four more mountains - Sugarloaf, Cracker, Spaulding and Saddleback – ranging in elevation from 3,988 feet to 4,232 feet! Three more days of up and down – like a heart monitor according to Jarred – and they arrived in Rangeley, Maine at 11:30 AM to resupply, then head back to the trail. 220 miles of hiking completed...1,959.1 miles to Springer Mountain, Georgia!

Did You Know - August Facts?

NUTRITIONAL SUPPORT

The paralysis is caused by an unknown mechanism which affects the nerves of the face. It is thought that a virus or immune system problem results in nerve swelling which produces the paralysis. Other causes of facial nerve paralysis are injury, tumors and ear infections.

Leafy green vegetables are rich in the B vitamins, especially vitamin B12 and vitamin B3 (niacin), which are needed for a healthy nervous system. Nutritional yeast, used daily as a bread spread, added to soups and sauces or sprinkled on salads is another good food source of B vitamins. Ensure that the essential fatty acids, required for the proper functioning of the nervous system, are included in your daily diet in the form of unrefined, cold-pressed flax seed oil, walnut oil or pumpkin seed oil. The essential fatty acids contained in these oils are converted in the body to prostaglandins which reduce inflammation. To keep swelling and pain to a minimum, avoid table salt, which causes water retention. Avoid red meats, as these are high in salt and promote inflammation. Most vegetables, especially broccoli, zucchini and carrots, are high in potassium and low in sodium and therefore help the body eliminate excess fluid and reduce swelling. Chili peppers contain an anti-inflammatory substance which reduces the sensitivity of nerve endings to pain.

The **B vitamins** are essential for the nerves and an important supplement in times of physical or emotional stress. Vitamin B1 will provide additional nerve support. B12 is essential. It is involved in many biochemical nerve processes. Supplementation has offered relief within a couple of weeks in many instances and has even spurred recovery in persistent, chronic cases. B12 injections were the most effective, as they treat the source of the problem specifically. The next best form of B12 is a sublingual tablet, dissolved under the tongue. Vitamin B12 absorbed through the mucous membranes in the mouth directly into the bloodstream. Evening primrose oil is rich in the essential fatty acid gamma-Linolenic acid (**GLA**), which provides the body with nutrients needed to combat inflammation and to support healthy nerve function. **Vitamin C** is always helpful against inflammation and should be taken regularly. The minerals magnesium and calcium are also recommended as they are essential for the nerves and to relieve spasms and cramps causing the problem.

Riverdale Fire Department has a Junior Fire Department and is currently looking for young adults between the ages of 16 and 18 to join. "Most of newest recruits started out as junior fire fighters," says Chief Dan Sturm. Continues the chief, "We are able to put the younger members through training earlier and retain them as opposed to an older resident who has families and other responsibilities. The increase in hours on the department and increase in the level of required training - Level 1 Firefighter went from 60 hours to 150 - discourages potential volunteers." Chief Sturm adds he was one of the town's first junior firefighters and the training and discipline has carried him through more than 30 years of fire fighting. With the summer well underway, the district prepares for the upcoming year. It is tick-bite season. If you are out in grassy or wooded areas, please don't forget to take the following precautions:

- ◆ Apply insect repellent to all exposed skin before heading out
- ◆ Check your body and your children's bodies upon return
- ◆ Consult a physician in the event that you notice an unexplained rash on yourself or your child.

Help Prevent Rabies

Summer is here, and people, pets, and wild animals alike are spending more time outdoors. Please just remember that the majority of rabies cases occur in wildlife, but your pets and other domestic animals can be infected when they are bitten by rabid wild animals. When "spillover" rabies occurs in domestic animals, the risk to humans is increased. So, this Summer, we ask you to take the following precautions:

- ◆ Visit your veterinarian with your pet on a regular basis and keep rabies vaccinations up-to-date for all cats, ferrets, and dogs.
- ◆ Maintain control of your pets by keeping cats and ferrets indoors and keeping dogs under direct supervision.
- ◆ Spay or neuter your pets to help reduce the number of unwanted pets that may not be properly cared for or vaccinated regularly.
- ◆ Call animal control to remove all stray animals from your neighborhood since these animals may be unvaccinated or ill.
- ◆ If you or a family member is bitten by a questionable animal, seek medical attention immediately.

The Morris County Housing Rehabilitation Program provides funds to income eligible homeowners to address major system failures in their primary residence. Program requirements:

- ◆ Funds are to be used for major repairs or conditions related to health or safety.
- ◆ Examples: roof or furnace replacement, upgrade electrical, construct new well or septic, sewer or water hook-ups, provide handicapped access, etc.
- ◆ Type of assistance: No interest, No payment 6-year or 10-year Forgivable Loan (Term is dependent on amount of assistance).
- ◆ Contact Community Development BEFORE any work is done or contracts signed.
- ◆ Permanent Morris County resident, lived in the house at least 1 year, the **only** house you own, and fall within income limits below.


