





Firemen Needed!

The department is looking to boost its roster with residents or workers in town who can respond to fires and other emergencies. Finding and holding on to new members, especially during the day, has long been a problem for volunteer fire departments.

Riverdale Fire Department has a Junior Fire Department and is currently looking for young adults between the ages of 16 and 18 to join. "Most of newest recruits started out as junior fire fighters," says Chief Dan Sturm. Continues the chief, "We are able to put the younger members through training earlier and retain them as opposed to an older resident who has families and other responsibilities. The increase in hours on the department and increase in the level of required training - Level 1 Firefighter went from 60 hours to 150 - discourages potential volunteers." Chief Sturm adds he was one of the town's first junior firefighters and the training and discipline has carried him through more than 30 years of fire fighting. The Riverdale Police Department in conjunction with the Pompton Lakes Police Department held a **Junior Police Academy** for kids entering 6, 7 and 8th grades. The Academy, in its second year, was a week long.

Each morning the junior recruits have their uniforms inspected by the police officers acting as drill instructors. This portion of the training is designed to teach discipline. The uniforms need to be neat, clean and work in the correct fashion. The recruits are required to show respect and address the officers by rank and gender. They also are required to participate in physical training after inspection.

The week was filled with exposure to different aspects of law enforcement. Some of the highlights of the week were the Passaic County Mounted Unit who explained and demonstrated the requirements and training for a police officer who rides a horse on patrol. The Riverdale K-9 Unit with Patrolman Pat Harden, K-9 Dugan, Passaic County Bomb Squad, Passaic County SWAT Team, Physician's Response Team and a number of other local officers educated the junior recruits on different aspects of police work. The Pompton Lakes Fire Department gave a demonstration about fire department response and the working relationship the police and fire departments have.

New to the program this year was a day at the Riverdale Police Pistol Range. The recruits were instructed in firearms safety and given a demonstration on different firearms that are used in police work. The recruits were offered an opportunity to shoot both a handgun and a rifle. This is a very strict and disciplined training.

This September marks the 7th annual *National Preparedness Month*. It is that time of year when we are asked how prepared our families are for the inevitable emergencies life will throw our way. It is important for us to think if we really want to be in crisis mode when an emergency occurs, frantic about where our loved ones are, about what to do and where to go. The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) was established by the Borough for neighbors to help each other in times of an emergency.



CERT is about preparedness, much like the Boy and Girl Scouts; it is people helping people. CERT is a positive and realistic approach to emergency and disaster situations where citizens will be initially on their own and their actions can make a difference. Through training, members will learn to assist with basic first aid, a breakdown in utilities and support emergency services during a prolonged critical incident.

The Riverdale CERT will be hosting an open meeting on Wednesday, September 22 at 7 PM in the Council Chambers. All borough residents are encouraged to attend. Each resident has unique skills and abilities. Please consider sharing them and learning new ones with your neighbors.

The recruits were bussed to Passaic County Police Academy and observed a real Police Recruit Class during their physical training and uniform inspection. In addition they received training from academy instructors on defensive driving by using a computerized driving simulator. The recruits observed a firearms training simulator that teaches law enforcement officers to react to hostile situations. Riverdale resident **Chris Miller**, owner and instructor of a martial arts gym taught self defense and all around physical fitness.

The Pompton Lakes/Fiverdale First Aid Squad was on hand each day checking the kids for any heat related issues and patching up any bumps and bruises that were acquired during training.

The week ended with a helicopter from the National Guard Armory landing at the Pompton Lakes High School. The helicopter is used by law enforcement in drug enforcement. The Army Pilots explained both the aircraft and the role it plays in working with law enforcement.

News from School

As the start of our new school year rapidly approaches, the staff and administration of Riverdale School look forward to our September 7 arrival of students. The summer months have been busy ones, as we continue to reflect upon our most recent school year and develop plans to foster continued success for our students.

A major focus of the district will be to strengthen the home school connection, utilizing technology as a communication tool and offering parent seminars to spotlight school initiatives. We have restructured our Back to School night, to provide greater insight into our programs. The Middle School (6-8) Back to School Night will take place on Sept. 28 and the Pre-K - 5 Back to School Night is scheduled for September 30. In response to parent inquiries, we will be introducing a password-protected, parental access to student grades online (grades 6-8). Additionally, student access to "E Suite," a web-based resource to support student review of skills presented in our Everyday Math program has been expanded to include grades K-5. Parents are encouraged to continue to visit the district website www.rpsnj.org for frequent updates of district, school and classroom information. The school event calendar is located as a link off of the principal's page and copies of flyers and correspondence sent home can be found in the "student backpack" on the homepage. We hope that increased parental access of these tools will reduce our use of paper over time.

Our new science textbook adoption (K-5) will provide our students with a variety of non-fiction ready opportunities designed to support and integrate study skills and technology, as students perform hands on experiments to promote conceptual understanding.

During the summer renovations of the 2nd floor restrooms and the nurse's area have occurred. These received the promise of 40% funding from the state, with the balance being supported through the capital reserve line of our budget. All three areas will be ADA compliant. Our nurse will also have quick access to the field behind the school, in case of emergency, as an external door has been installed. *Submitted by Dr. Betty Ann Wyks, Superintendent*

Healthy Living

For a lot of health-minded foodies, cocktails are the undiscovered country....Well, recent research and a new wave of imaginative bartenders and chefs suggest it's time to start filling your highball glass with the same delicious, antioxidant-rich fruits and vegetables you use in your kitchen. Even better, studies show that a little alcohol might make those healthy ingredients healthier and more easily absorbed.

"A 2007 study by Thai and U.S. researchers found that alcohol enhances the antioxidant capacity of fresh fruits, increasing their ability to scavenge free radicals from the bloodstream," says Breea Johnson, M.S., R.D., L.D.N., an integrative nutritionist and registered dietitian in private practice in Chicago. The discovery, which was made accidentally by researchers attempting to preserve strawberries and blackberries by treating them with alcohol, has generated a lot of media buzz.

Some of the healthiest and tastiest cocktail mixers don't come in containers - you find them at the farmers market and spice store....Our experts show you how to do the real thing with their favorite healthy cocktail ingredients.

Beet juice Taste before you cringe. Its distinctive flavor goes well with vodka, and the deep-red glow of the beets come from the antioxidant anthocyanin, which helps rid the body of free radicals that have been linked to cancer and heart disease.

Carrot juice Famously packed with beta-carotene, fresh-pressed carrot juice is also a naturally occurring sweetener that pairs well with sour and bitter flavors. Try mixing with fresh ginger and Campari.

Cinnamon Research suggests the sweet yet slightly bitter spice, which goes nicely with rum, can help regulate blood glucose.

Honey A healthier alternative to traditional simply syrup, honey may help provide relief from seasonal allergies if it's made from the pollen of local flowers. Mixes well with rum, especially when its hot.

Pomegranate juice Antioxidant-rich pomegranate juice is a popular source of color and fresh taste in cosmopolitans and martinis. A 2010 study published in the journal *Cancer Prevention Research* found that the ellagitannins plentiful in pomegranates may help slow or even prevent the growth of breast cancer cells.

Rosemary The pine-like notes of rosemary go well with other botanicals and honey, and the essential oils in this fresh herb help improve digestion and boost immunity.

Numerous studies have identified a correlation between moderate drinking (defined as one to two drinks a day) and a longer, healthier life. But to date, no study suggests what specific role alcohol plays in longevity. "In cultures where moderate drinking is more common than in the U.S., there tends to be a lower incidence of heart disease," notes nutritionist Breea Johnson. "But diets in those countries, such as France and Italy, tend to favor healthier fats and better-quality meat, and people overall appear to be more relaxed - taking long walks and afternoon naps." Most practitioners will not "prescribe" alcohol for any health condition and are careful to note that drinking more than one cocktail a day can do more harm than good to your liver and brain.

In addition, a recent study in California of breast cancer survivors found that drinking more than three alcoholic drinks a week could increase breast cancer survivor's risk of recurrence by 30 percent. "We suggest that women with a history of breast cancer should consider limiting themselves to less than half a drink per day," says lead researcher Marilyn L. Kwan, Ph.D.

Blueberry Lavender Mojito

This cocktail calls for lavender syrup: Bring 1 cup water, 1/2 cup super-fine organic sugar and 1/4 cup dried organic lavender to a boil, reduce to a simmer and cook for about 10 minutes, then pour through a fine sieve into a sterilized glass container with a lid and refrigerate.

10-15 mint leaves
1 ounce lavender syrup
Juice of 1/2 lime
15-20 blueberries (3 or 4 garnish)
1 1/2 ounces white rum
Crushed ice
Club soda
Cocktail pick or toothpick

In a tall glass, muddle mint leaves, lavender syrup, lime juice, 15 blueberries and rum. Muddle just enough to combine flavors, being careful not to over-muddle (you can strain if you prefer). Fill glass with crushed ice. Top with club soda. Stir until well-blended. To garnish, place 3-4 blueberries on a cocktail pick. Serve with straw. **Per serving** 176 calories, <1g fat (<1g saturated) <1g protein, 18g carbohydrates, 1g fiber, 8mg sodium

Pear Lime Chile Cocktail

The unusual note of jalapeno peppers in this drink comes from mudding tow jalapeno slices and then garnishing with a sliced whole pepper on the glass.

2 slices of jalapenos (thin sections)
1/2 lime (in 2 quarters)
2 ounces agave nectar
2 ounces pear liqueur
2 ounces vodka
Crushed ice
Club soda
Whole jalapeno (for garnish)

In a shaker, muddle jalapeno slices, lime and agave nectar. Add pear liqueur, vodka and ice. Shake well and strain into a tall cocktail glass. Top with club soda and garnish with a sliced jalapeno.

Per serving 603 calories, <1g fat (0g saturated), <1g protein, 92g carbohydrates, <1g fiber, 11mg sodium.
