A Word from Fire Chief Dan Sturm



- Smoke alarms should be installed on every level of the home (including the basement), outside each sleeping area, and inside each bedroom. Larger homes may need additional smoke alarms. Never remove or disable smoke alarms.
 - Interconnection of smoke alarms is highly recommended; when one smoke alarm sounds, they all do. (This is particularly important in larger or multi-story homes, where the sound from distant smoke alarms may be reduced to the point that it may not be loud enough to provide proper warning, especially for sleeping individuals.) A licensed electrician can install either hard-wired multiple-station alarms. Wireless alarms, which manufacturers have more recently begun producing, can be installed by the homeowner.
 - There are two types of smoke alarm technologies – ionization and photoelectric. An ionization smoke alarm is generally more responsive to flaming fires – like a pan fire or the smoke from cooking. A photoelectric alarm is generally more responsive to smoldering fires – like a cigarette, overheated wiring or something hot like a space heater. Install both types of alarms in your home or combination ionization and photoelectric alarms that take advantage of both technologies.
 - Test smoke alarms at least monthly by pushing the test button. If an alarm “chirps,” warning the battery is low, replace the battery right away.
- All smoke alarms, including alarms that use 10-year batteries and those that are hard-wired alarms, should be replaced when they're 10 years old (or sooner) if they do not respond properly when tested.



Natural Health

MCURGENT Riverdale has joined with Morris County in developing a shared emergency information network that will be used by the county and the borough to quickly disseminate information to the public in the event of an emergency. The network is called MCUrgent, which will get the word out through Twitter and Facebook and Text Messaging on your cell phone. 



KITCHEN SINKS. Stainless-steel sinks should never be cleaned with abrasive cleaners, which will scratch the surface; you'll never be able to get the sink to look good again. If you feel you must use a powdered cleanser, be sure to rub WITH the grain of the stainless steel rather than in circles or in the opposite direction. To clean stainless steel sinks, use baking soda; even some liquid cleansers may scratch the surfaces. ALWAYS read those labels! Just sprinkle some baking soda in the sink and scrub with a damp cloth. Vinegar is great for removing water spots and attacking gunk buildup. **WASHING DISHES.** Dip washed dishes in a vinegar water bath to rinse them clean. To protect your fine crystal, line the sink with a thick dish towel or washcloth. Be sure to wear rubber gloves, because you can rinse glasses with hotter water that way, which means they dry faster. Soak dishes and pans with dried egg or milk in cold water. Hot water actually cooks these foods onto their containers and makes cleaning more work. To get maximum dishwasher efficiency, start by choosing the right detergent. Shake the box of powdered detergent; if you can't hear the granules rattling inside, don't buy it. Lumpy dishwasher detergent won't dissolve well enough to do its job. Find a better place to store detergent than under the kitchen sink, where its moist and warm - it is the worst place to store powdered dishwasher detergent. 



The Ghiott Company is made up of Florentine confectioners with a rich history. Their creations accompany coffee, vin santo and conversation throughout Italy and beyond. You can find them in the picturesque Chianti region of Tuscany, near the famous Passignano Abbey. Located on a branch of the road known locally as the Strada Senese del Sambuco, it was the Florentines' preferred way to Siena until at least 1200, after which better routes were found.

The Ghiott Company was founded in Florence in 1953 by Enzo Salaorni. Salaorni, like generations of his ancestors, was a master Tuscan confectioner. This gave him access to recipes dating as far back as the Renaissance. Salaorni took one of the *cantuccini* recipes, changed it a bit, and created Ghiottini. (*Cantuccini* are what we think of as *biscotti*, but in Italy, all cookies are *biscotti*. *Cantuccini* are the oblong, twice baked creations that are perfect for dunking). This almond-based delicacy became so popular that today it is Ghiott's most famous product.



Ghiottini are BVQI certified, which is an international standard ensuring both the quantity and quality of ingredients that are both traceable and typical of the region without artificial coloring or preservatives. In this case, it means whole, skinned, Mediterranean almonds, 'A' class egg yolks and sweet Millefiori honey.

Ghiott's other beloved products include Brutti e Buoni (the ultimate Tuscan cookie, crunchy with a soft, sweet center), Amaretti (soft cookies made with stone-ground rice flour, sweet and bitter almonds, sugar and whipped egg whites), Panforte Morbido (soft, round cake filled with candied fruit and almonds) and Ricciarelli (soft, oval pastry with almond paste that are considered good luck. They also make a chocolate version).

Although Ghiott has modernized its production technology to keep up with international demand, the Salaorni family retains its focus on manual processing methods and simple, high quality ingredients.


