is a non profit organization that helps to improve the quality of life for people with spinal cord injuries (SCI) through an intensive exercise program.

Specialized trainers provide one-on-one individualized workouts with each client.



Clients are people with spinal cord injuries and other neurological disorders or conditions. If they live locally they come for weekly sessions; people traveling from out of state may come for one or two weeks of intensive training and go home with a program they can follow on their own.



Traditionally, people with SCI are taught to adapt to life in their wheelchairs. We believe that getting people up and out of their chairs, providing proper stimulus, and assisting with weight bearing activities can help the brain reconnect with the nervous system, resulting in new strength and function. *Continued on Page 5*

Fusion Flavor Program Prepares Girl Scouts for Peru Trip

NEW JERSEY GIRLS SCOUTS OF NORTH

Jockey Hollow Girl Scout Camp transformed itself into a South American territory, complete with traditional food and dance and Peruvian storytelling. Girl Scouts of Northern New Jersey held its *Fusion Flavor* program at the camp on November 14 and 15. The program taught 67 girls and 31 adults about South American culture, laying the groundwork for a trip to Peru in December 2011.

The *Fusion Flavor* overnight let girls experience a new culture and earn a badge from Peruvian Girl Guides (the equivalent of a Girl Scout). They spent two days learning how to cook traditional South American foods, take Zumba dance lessons, and hike through the woods of Mendham, reading chapters from a traditional Peruvian legend along the way. On Sunday morning, the girls talked to a Girl Guide in Peru via Skype, and Internet application that allows users to make free calls all over the world.

The Girl Scouts and their leaders also had a chance to learn about the upcoming trip to Peru. Girls, 14 and older, will be traveling to Peru to connect with Girl Guides and begin the Camp Hemisphere Project. This will establish a summer camp program from the Girl Guides of Peru, similar to the summer program Girl Scouts experience in the United States.

International programs allow for experimental learning, developing girls' skills in leadership and cultural understanding, and opening them up to new ideas and opportunities. The experiences they gain through international travel serve them in the future.

Another component of the Camp Hemisphere project is recruiting college-aged and young professional volunteers to deliver the Girl Scout Leadership Experience to girls. The majority of volunteers and leaders are mothers whose daughters have joined the program. The Camp Hemisphere program will provide opportunities to develop the next generation of Girl Scout leaders directly from the Girl Scout program. Sandra's Recipe of the Month: Shiitake and Kale

Prep time: 2 minutes; Cooking time: 10 minutes; Serves: 4

Ingredients

- 1/2 pound of shiitake mushrooms
- 1 tablespoon of olive oil
- 1-2 cloves of crushed garlic
- 1 bunch of kale
- Pinch of salt

Directions

1. Warm oil in pan on medium heat with minced garlic until aroma of garlic is released, about 2-3 minutes.
2. Add chopped shiitake mushrooms, stir fry for 5 minutes.
3. Then add chopped kale, stir fry for a couple of minutes.
4. Add a splash of water and pinch of salt to pan, cover and let steam for 4 minutes.

Push to Walk Lori Douma is a Riverdale resident who is a client. She is very grateful that such a program exists right in her own town. Lori is paralyzed from the waist down from Lyme disease and works out twice a week to improve her health and strength. As a full time Speech-Language Pathologist in the Little Falls school system, Lori knows how important it is to stay healthy and continually work toward recovery. Push to Walk helps her reach those goals.

Darren Templeton's parents, John and Cynthia, formed Push to Walk in 2007 because there was no facility like this on the whole East Coast. Darren knew he wanted to work towards recovery using exercise based methods. After working with a personal trainer, the idea to form Push to Walk was born. The Templeton's live in Kinnelon, and despite having a C5 SCI (he broke his neck in a diving

accident in July 2004), Darren graduated from Ramapo College this past May and now attends Rutgers in Newark for his MBA. He lived on campus for three years, drives a modified van and plays wheelchair rugby. Thanks to his workouts at Push to Walk, Darren has regained strength and function to live quite independently and is glad that this organization can help so many others.




