The fall season is officially upon us in the Borough of Riverdale. Time to head out for some apple and pumpkin picking with the family.

Mark you calendars for our annual "Fright Night" sponsored by the Recreation Department. This year's event will take place on Tuesday, October 18th from 6:00pm - 8:00pm at the Glenburn Estate on Hamburg Turnpike. There will be plenty of activities including hay rides, a haunted house, DJ entertainment, crafts, snacks, and much more. Put on your costume and join us for a fun night with neighbors and friends.

I am pleased to announce that the Pequannock River Basin Regional Sewer Authority approved Riverdale's Phase I sewer expansion at their September meeting. Riverdale can finally start preparing bid specifications and financially make plans. The proposed plan starts with Newbury Place, Brown Court, and Oak Street, where the borough recently received a DOT grant of \$90,000 for road improvements.

On October 26th, Tilcon will make their annual presentation to the Borough Council on the status of quarry operations. We have been working with Tilcon all year to improve the quality of life for our residents. This meeting will be a great opportunity to see the improvements that have been made and the proposed plans for the future. Hope to see you there.

As we approach Halloween, I ask all of you to be safe and have an enjoyable night of Trick or Treating. Keep your eyes out for the little ones.

Linda Vogel's Recipes *Sausage-And-Peppers Burgers*

Ingredients:

- Buns
- Salt
- Olive oil
- 1 clove garlic, grated
- ¼ tsp. dried oregano
- 1 red onion, sliced
- 4 slices of Provolone cheese
- Pepper 1 lb. lean ground beef
- 3 links of sweet Italian sausage, casings removed
- 2 bell peppers (1 red, 1 yellow) cut into ½ wide strips



Directions:
Combine ground beef, sausage, garlic, oregano, ¼ tsp. salt and a few grinds of pepper in a bowl. Mix with hands until just combined. Form into 4 thick patties. Brush frying pan with olive oil. Cook burgers till brown and cooked through. Add cheese on top of burgers and cover for 2 minutes. In another frying pan add oil, peppers and onions. Toss the items together until lightly browned and tender. Put aside when cooked.


Halloween Fire Safety Tips

- »»» **When choosing a costume**, stay away from billowing or long trailing fabric. If your child is wearing a mask, make sure the eye holes are large enough so they can see out.
- »»» **Provide children** with flashlights to carry for lighting or glow sticks as part of their costume.
- »»» Dried flowers, cornstalks and crepe paper are highly flammable. **Keep** these and other decorations well away from all open flames and heat sources, including light bulbs, and heaters.
- »»» **It is safest to use** a flashlight or battery-operated candle in a jack-o-lantern. If you use a real candle, use extreme caution. Make sure children are watched at all times when candles are lit. When lighting candles inside jack-o-lanterns, use long, fireplace-style matches or a utility lighter. Be sure to place lit pumpkins well away from anything that can burn and far enough out of way of trick-or-treaters, doorsteps, walkways and yards.
- »»» **Remember** to keep exits clear of decorations, so nothing blocks escape routes.
- »»» **Tell children** to stay away from open flames. Be sure they know how to stop, drop and roll if their clothing catches fire. (Have them practice, stopping immediately, dropping to the ground, covering their face with hands, and rolling over and over to put the flames out.)

Use flashlights as alternatives to candles or torch lights when decorating walkways and yards. They are much safer for trick-or-treaters, whose costumes may brush against the lighting.

If your children are going to **Halloween parties** at others' homes, have them look for ways out of the home and plan how they would get out in an emergency.

Decorations are the first thing to ignite in 1,000 reported home fires each year.


