We had a very productive and exciting month of April in the Borough of Riverdale. Some highlights are noted below:

- The Borough Council adopted the 2016 Municipal Budget in a timely and cost efficient manner.
- We are finishing up final preparations for our annual Memorial Day parade scheduled for Monday, May 30, 2016 at 10:00am
- The Newark-Pompton Turnpike banner sponsor program has been an overwhelming success. We expect the new banners to be installed by Memorial Day. Thank you for all the local businesses that sponsored banners for the project. In addition to the banners, 15 of the streetlights will have new flower baskets and American flags!
- As displayed on the cover, our local hero Sergeant Greg Bogert made national headlines by showing us all what police work is all about. Proof that our Police Department is ready at all times!
- We have started the financial study for the Sewer Expansion Project. As you may know, the Borough purchased additional allocation last year and we are now planning how to roll that out. We will keep you posted.
- We continue to work with Tilcon to ensure a better quality of life as we coexist with quarry operations. Tilcon has started to do their part, sweeping our streets, providing blasting reports, and installing equipment to reduce dust. They also made a \$10,000 donation towards our effort to install a digital sign at Borough Hall.

**From the desks of Riverdale School Superintendent,  
Mrs. Vicki Pede, and Principal, Mr. Sean Bowe:**

Our school district is appreciative of the support of members of the community; the showing of your faith in us is overwhelming – thank you! On Tuesday, April 19, 2016, our school budget passed with the approval of the voters; again, thank you for your support as we continue to plan for the educational experiences for our children. In addition, the school colors were voted on – two homerooms tied with having the most voters (86.7%) for this election! It was great to see so many of our school students come out to vote in this election which was modeled closely to the budget vote. For your information, we are now in the process of finalizing the school sign and website design with what was voted on not so long ago. An additional area of support you may also have noticed are the bollards around our building which will assist in providing additional safety for all of our inhabitants. These were graciously donated and installed by Tilcon; we will be painting them in our school colors to look like crayons for our elementary school!

We are almost at the end of the PARCC testing that was instituted for students in grades 3 through 8. As noted previously, PARCC is an acronym standing for the Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Careers. Before the next school year, we have been told that the results of the testing will allow us to adequately prepare for the students’ needs. Following the conclusion of this testing, our fourth and eighth graders will take the science portion of the NJASK (New Jersey Assessment of Skills and Knowledge). Results of both testing sessions will be shared at a public Board of Education meeting in the fall. Thank you for your assistance in assuring that your children are ready for the rigors of this testing through your attention to those needs beyond the educational components!

There is a poem by Wolf entitled *Don’t Quit* which contains numerous lines that make considerable sense. A portion of the poem reads as follows:

“Don’t quit over doubts and questions,  
For there’s something you may learn.”

Think about those words; we can certainly learn from so many situations and we are all learning that each and every day! I ask that you please remember that our baseball and softball seasons are underway; come out to support the efforts of our students! We are so very fortunate to be a part of a community that is so supportive of the educational components of our school! Please know that you are always welcome at Riverdale School!

Also, Bob Benedetto, who gave us an oil-painting demonstration last month, is willing to give interested members a free lesson. Gloria feels that art is very therapeutic and that we should take advantage of this offer. She is coordinating a date and time and will present it shortly. Interested members were also given a date for their oil painting instruction by Bob Benedetto. Gloria announced that the Riverdale senior walking club will meet on Thursday mornings at 9:15 from April 28th to June 9th. She asked if anyone would like to share news with us - Gerry Mahler proudly held up a picture of her new great-grandson and Jo Torre announced that Mary Gambino would be having a special milestone birthday this weekend. Congratulations to both of you!






