OTHER BUSINESS:

1. Rabies Clinic.

Linda Roetman stated there has never been a clinic where we had exceeded seventy-five animals, however; this clinic we vaccinated 231 animals. The reason we had so many is because the surrounding towns and other towns in other counties have been canceling the rabies clinics on account of not being able to get veterinarian. We are fortunate that the same vet has been doing our clinics for four years now. She is from the Livingston Animal Hospital and is very good. Linda Roetman stated she spoke to the Mayor about giving her an increase because we have been paying her \$225.00 for the clinics and she works very hard and out of that she pays her assistant. The Mayor agreed we should give her \$500.00 for each clinic. The money comes from the Dog Reserve Account and we have to use the money from the account for this use and the survey that will be done this summer by the police.
